Belhaven College Begins Campus Day of Learning

Jackson, Miss. (September 14, 2004) – Beginning this fall, Belhaven College will offer a new program, Campus Day of Learning. This event is designed to bring students, faculty and staff together to learn and discuss specific topics. This semester’s topic is “The Uniqueness of Christ.”

The program will include lectures from Dr. J. Ligon Duncan III and Dr. Zachariah Gaye as well as two breakout sessions that will allow time for small group discussions.

“The goal of the program is to provide an opportunity for the students, faculty and staff to not only hear the speakers, but to interact with one another about the topic,” said Dr. Dan Fredericks, senior vice president and provost at Belhaven College. “This topic, ‘The Uniqueness of Christ,’ is critical to the mission and foundation of Belhaven College.”

Speaker Dr. J. Ligon Duncan is the senior minister of the historic First Presbyterian Church in Jackson. He was elected Moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in America last year and serves as Secretary of the Board for Belhaven College.

Speaker Zachariah Gaye is assistant professor of educational foundations and leadership for the school of education at Jackson State University. Gaye is the co-director and coordinator of the Cultivating Talent for Teaching Project.
