## **Classical Campus Education Pioneer Addresses Belhaven College**

**JACKSON, Miss. (Date)** – Dr. George Grant, one of the leaders of classical campus education and director of the King’s Meadow Study Center in Franklin, Tenn., will speak at Belhaven College on Tuesday, September 7 at 6:30 p.m. in the Barber Auditorium.

Grant’s speech, “Lifetime Learning: The Great Tradition of Christian and Classical Education”, is free and open to the public.

The King’s Meadow Study Center is a not-for-profit educational organization, first established in 1980 and then reconstituted in its present form in 1993. Its purpose is assist the modern church to promote a practical cultural expression of the Christian worldview—in art, music, literature, politics, social research, community development and education.

Grant is the author of numerous books in the areas of history, biography, politics, literature and social criticism. His work on behalf of the homeless, for international relief and development, for racial reconciliation, and for the sanctity of life has been profiled in such varied media outlets as the Wall Street Journal, the Washington Post, Focus on the Family, the 700 Club, the Coral Ridge Hour, Point of View, Crossfire, World Magazine and Christianity Today.

Belhaven College is a Christian liberal arts college founded in 1894 and is the only evangelical college that offers majors in each of the creative arts; art, music, dance theatre, and creative writing.
