JACKSON, Miss. (Jan. 19, 2005) — In honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Belhaven College sponsored its annual College-Wide Service Day Monday, Jan. 17, 2005. Students, faculty and staff spent the day working with the North Mid-Town Community Development, Habitat for Humanity and the Greater Belhaven Neighborhood Association.

“This day is part of our commitment to helping others have better lives because of the life we have in Jesus Christ,” said Scott Little, Belhaven’s director of student leadership. “We enjoy honoring the memory of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and serving our neighbors in tangible ways.”

Belhaven students, faculty and staff spent the day working on a number of projects in the Belhaven and North Midtown neighborhoods:

- landscaping and clean-up along Millsaps to Mill Street
- landscaping at the Greater Belhaven Neighborhood Foundation building, 954 Fortification Street.
- clean-up along Riverside Drive.
- clean-up around Laurel Street Park.
- new home development and construction at Habitat for Humanity home site, 943 Hunt Street.

This is the seventh year Belhaven College has held the Martin Luther King Jr. community workday. This project is one of many community service projects the college sponsors throughout the year.
