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Mac OS X

1. Download archived photos (zip file) from website and un-archive the photos to a folder in the picture folder inside your user directory (Macintosh HD:[YourUserName]\Pictures\[NewPhotos]), i.e., if your username is Audrey and the folder name for the new photos is Belhaven, then the location for the new photos would be Macintosh HD\Audrey\Pictures\Belhaven.
2. Click on the round Apple Icon (upper left) and click on the System Preferences.
3. Click the “Desktop and Screen Saver” icon.
4. At the top of the menu click the “Screensaver” tab.
5. On the left, scroll down and click the “choose folder” option.
6. Browse to the location of the folder where the photos are located and select the folder.
8. A preview should be occurring in the sample screen. Below this preview screen is an “Options” button and a “Start Screen Saver” slide. Use these features to set the start of the screensaver and other options you desire.
9. Close menu.

XP - “My Pictures Slideshow” screensaver.

1. Download archived photos (zip file) from website and un-archive the photos to a folder in the “My Pictures” folder inside your “My Documents” folder (C:\Documents and Settings\[YourUserName]\My Documents\My Pictures\[NewPhotos]), i.e., if your username is Audrey and the folder name for the new photos is Belhaven, then the location for the new photos would be C:\Documents and Settings\Audrey\My Documents\My Pictures\Belhaven.

2. Click on the Windows Start button (lower left) and click on the Control Panel menu item.

3. Click the Appearance and Themes link in the Control Panel.

4. Click on the Choose screen Saver link in the Appearance and Themes window.

5. Select My Pictures Slideshow from the Screen Saver dropdown list.

6. Click on the Settings Button.

7. Click on the Browse button, navigate to the location of the folder where the photos are located and select the folder.

8. Set how often you want your pictures to change with the slider bar.

9. Set how big you want your pictures with the slider bar.

10. Check the appropriate check boxes to indicate if you want: Small pictures to be stretched; File names to be displayed; Transition effects to be used between pictures; and/or Keyboard scrolling of pictures.

11. Click on OK

11. Optionally, change Wait from default value of 10 minutes to the value you prefer.

12. Click on OK.

13. Close Control Panel.

These instructions assume the user has not modified the standard Windows XP desktop settings.

Vista

1. Download archived photos (zip file) from website and un-archive the photos to a folder in the picture folder inside your user directory (C:\Users\[YourUserName]\Pictures\[NewPhotos]), i.e., if your username is Audrey and the folder name for the new photos is Belhaven, then the location for the new photos would be C:\Users\Audrey\Pictures\Belhaven.
2. Click on the round Windows Start button (lower left) and click on the Control Panel menu item.
3. Double click the Personalization icon in the Control Panel.
4. Click on the Screen Saver menu item.
5. Select Photos from the Screen Saver dropdown list.
6. Click on the Settings Button.
7. Browse to the location of the folder where the photos are located and select the folder.
8. Set the Slide Show speed by selecting Slow, Medium or Fast in the dropdown menu.
9. Click the checkbox if you want to shuffle the contents of the photos folder.
10. Click on Save
11. Optionally, change Wait from default value of 10 minutes to the value you prefer.
12. Click on OK.
13. Close Control Panel.
